#0171 AP HUMAN GEOGRAPHY (TELEPRESESCENCE)

Advanced Placement Human Geography year long course meets requirements of semester long intro human geography course at college level. Study of interactions of people in different cultures, ethnicities and contributions to cultural landscape of planet. Use GSI apps to demonstrate mastery, and application of research and learning. Expected to take College Board exam in May to earn possible extra credit.

#0982 WEBSITE DESIGN-1 SEMESTER CLASS

A one-semester course where students will demonstrate the ability to use Internet technology as both a resource for academic research and a vehicle for presenting that research. Student outcomes will be exclusively project-based.

#0952 COMPUTER SCIENCE CP

Introduction for students interested in developing web sites and software apps, not just using them. Students use open-software tools such as Alice,Scratch,and Pythone. Students who finish this course will be prepared to enter AP Computer Science that focuses on complexities in object-oriented design using JAVA.

#1465 AUTO SHOP (ROP) YEARLONG CLASS AND CAN BE TAKEN TWICE FOR CREDIT

This course will involve the study of actual engines and other components of the automobile chassis. Students will be given opportunities to disassemble and reassemble these shop models. This class must be taken for two semesters in order to advance to Advanced Auto Shop.

#1670 AIR FORCE JUNIOR RESERVE OFFICER TRAINING CORPS (AFJROTC)

This is a year-long course which exposes students to military history, discipline, leadership principles, with an emphasis on Air Force.

#1312 ART CP -YEARLONG COURSE AND FULFILLS A-G REQUIREMENT FOR A 4 YEAR COLLEGE

This course explores the fundamentals of art which include the elements and principles of designs, basic drawing, painting, and additional art exercises.

#1315 DRAWING CP- YEARLONG CLASS AND FULFILLS A-G REQUIREMENT FOR A 4 YEAR COLLEGE

The course introduces the studio arts pertaining to drawing. The course will emphasize the basic elements of art. Various drawing and techniques will be introduced to the student. The student will have the opportunity to create works in various mediums.

#1316 SCULPTURE CP

One year course - Students explore art fundamentals through sculptural techniques, elements of art and principles of design, hands on construction. Final sculpture completed with intention of end of year exhibit. Students learn to discuss and appreciate art through written critiques. Course aimed at fulfilling criterion at University of California's "F" curriculum.

#0964 MULTIMEDIA DESIGN CP-YEARLONG COURSE AND FULFILLS A-G REQUIREMENT FOR A 4 YEAR COLLEGE.

This course is an Introductory level course designed to educate students in the art, craft, and technology of multimedia including image manipulation and web design. Second semester focuses on video production and animation.

#1564 THEATRE ARTS CP- YEARLONG COURSE AND FULFILLS A-G REQUIREMENT FOR A 4 YEAR COLLEGE

This course is a first year course that introduces students to basic theatre concepts including acting, directing, play production, dramatic criticism, improvisation, and ensemble techniques. This is a performance-based class.

#1169 FOODS I

Students will prepare foods using a variety of cooking methods. Food preparation and care of equipment will be included along with good nutrition. Course includes laboratory cooking experience. This is a fee class; fees are charged for student projects taken home and kept by the student. Fee reductions and waivers can be arranged with the teacher if necessary.

#1170 Prerequisite: Foods I FOODS II

The creative study of foods with experiences to include regional cooking in the United States, gourmet cooking with herbs and spices, international foods, and special foods for entertaining groups.

#1553 CANTARE (GIRLS CHOIR)- YEARLONG COURSE AND FULFILLS HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION ART REQUIREMENT

Open to soprano/alto voices. Participation in concerts given for school and community groups and choral festivals required.

#1550 VARSITY CHOIR (BOYS CHOIR)- YEARLONG COURSE AND FULFILLS HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION ART REQUIREMENT

Open to tenor/bass voices. Participation in concerts given for school and community groups and choral festivals required.

#1536 SYMPHONIC BAND-YEAR LONG COURSE

Prerequisite: An interest in instrumental music and knowledge of instrumental techniques. Open to all who play woodwind or brass instruments. Travels and performs at area band festivals-2nd sem.

#1537 STRING ENSEMBLE- YEAR LONG COURSE

Prerequisite: at least two years experience on an orchestral string instrument or teacher approval.

#1539 MARCHING BAND- YEAR LONG COURSE

Prerequisite: Open to all students. Selection by director. This class is offered after school as a 7th period class. The RHS Terrier Marching Band is composed of woodwind, brass, and percussion participants as well as color guard members (flags and rifles) selected by audition in the prior spring.
